Hello and happy summer! I hope you are all enjoying a nice vacation, family time, and some summer adventures. I'm very excited to begin as the 6th-12th grade principal and looking forward to a new and exciting year full of growth and enriching activities! Joliet School has enjoyed success in academics, activities, and other student endeavors. Strong parental and community support enhances the quality of education at our school. Please don't hesitate to reach out and be involved in your children's experiences at Joliet School. I encourage you to read the newsletter and keep the enclosed calendar for future reference to assist you with school dates and activities.

Registration for juniors and seniors will be Tuesday, August 9th, and freshmen/sophomores will be Wednesday, August 10th. Information packets were mailed to all high school students with class and time details. In regards to middle school, the district will handle all scheduling for your student(s) before the beginning of the 2022-2023 school year. 6th and 7th grade students will be enrolled in math, science, English, social studies, PE/Health, Art/JMG (Jobs for Montana Graduates), and the choice of either band, choir, and/or study hall. 8th graders will be enrolled in math, science, English, social studies, PE/Health, Art/JMG, and Ag Ed/Media Arts. Please talk with your child regarding their choice of either band, choir, or study hall. Band runs on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday. Choir runs on Tuesday and Thursday. Students may elect band and/or choir. Students electing only band or choir will be enrolled in a study hall during off days. Students will be asked to communicate their choice to their first period teacher on the first day of school.

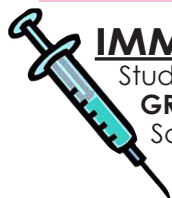

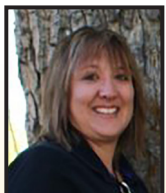
MS/HS LOCKERS

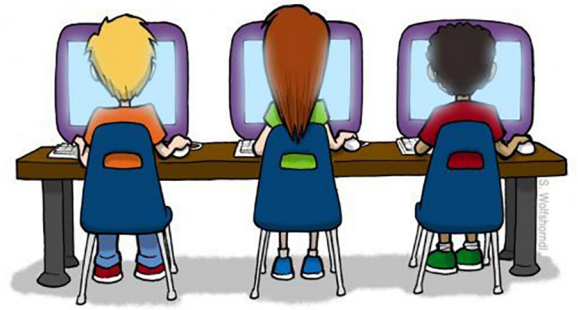

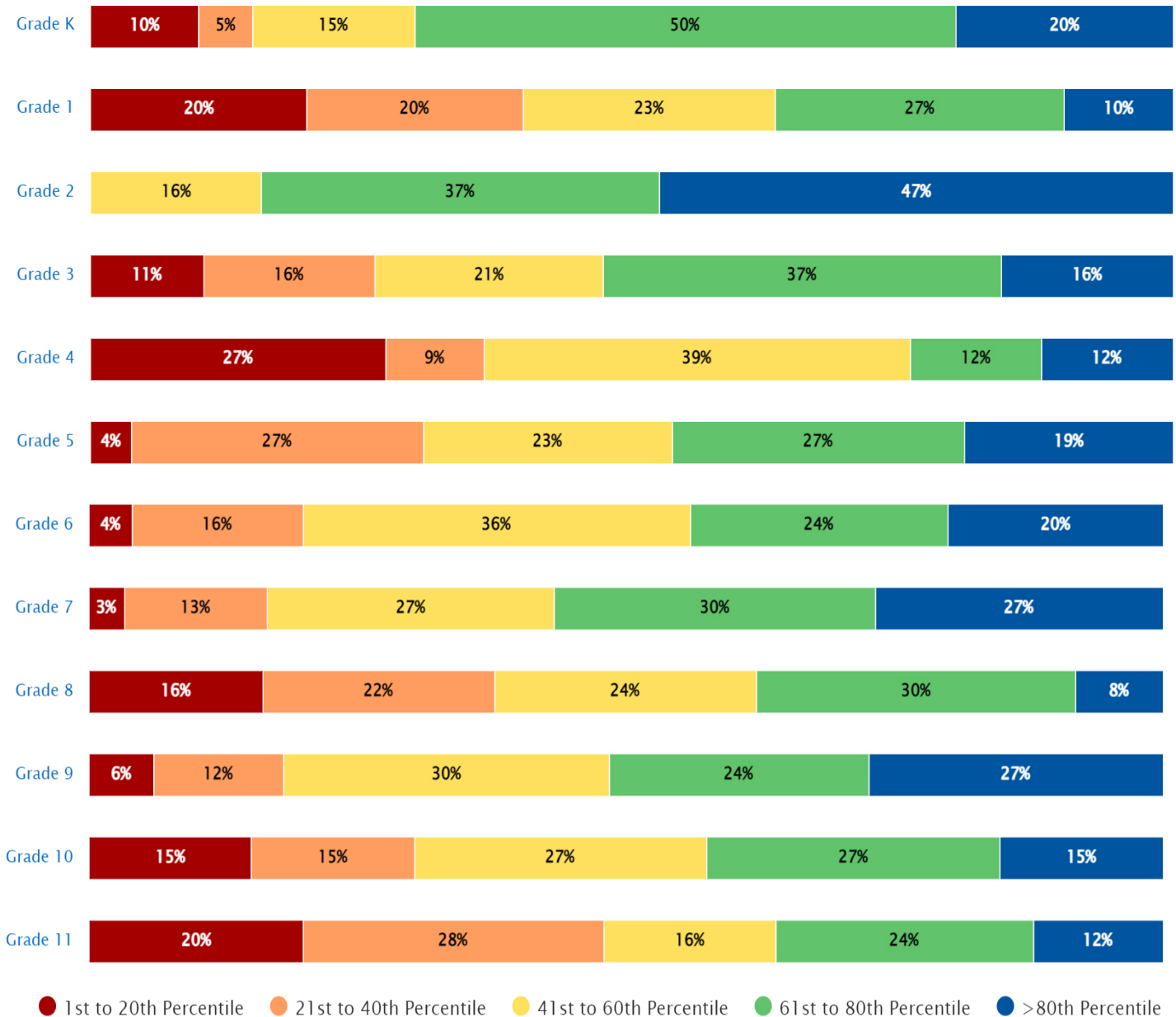
Academic Achievement - Testing

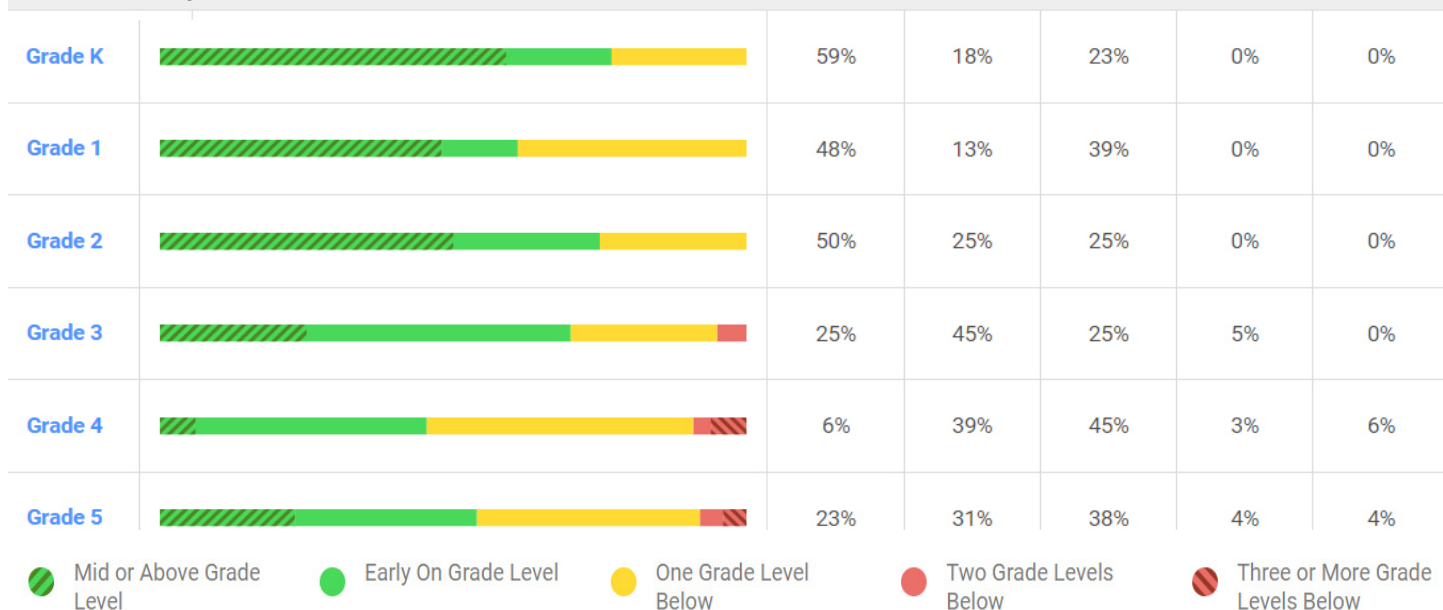

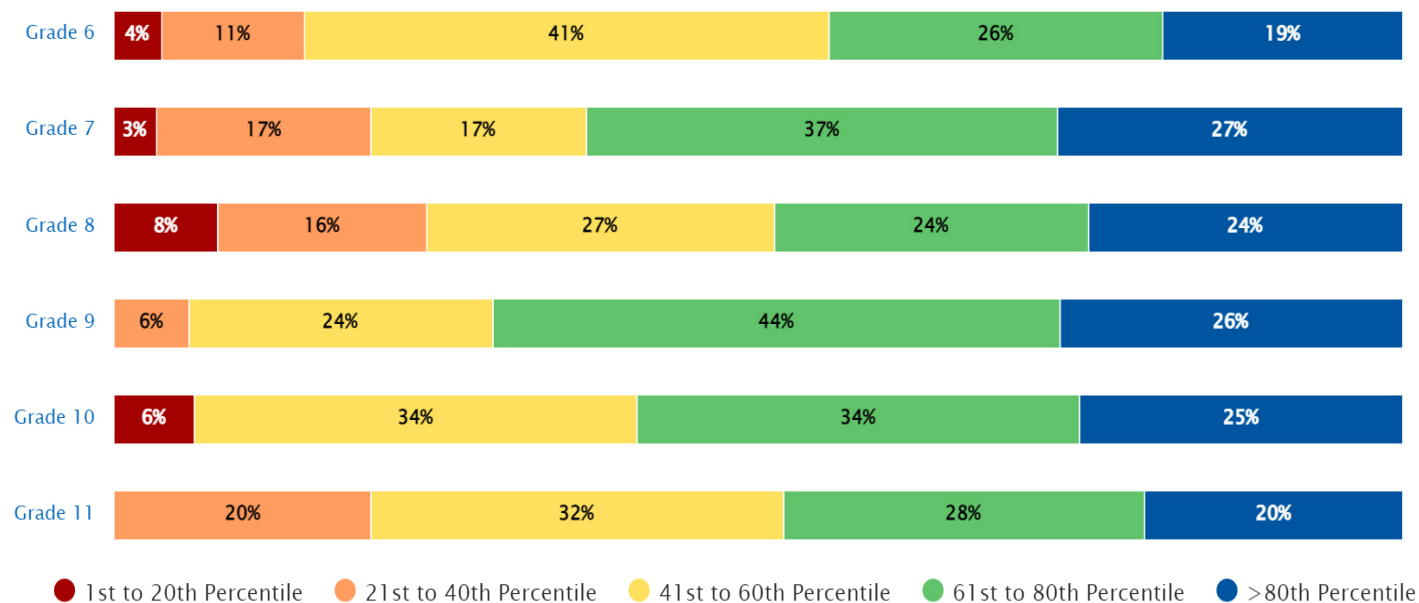
School Achievement: Reading K-11



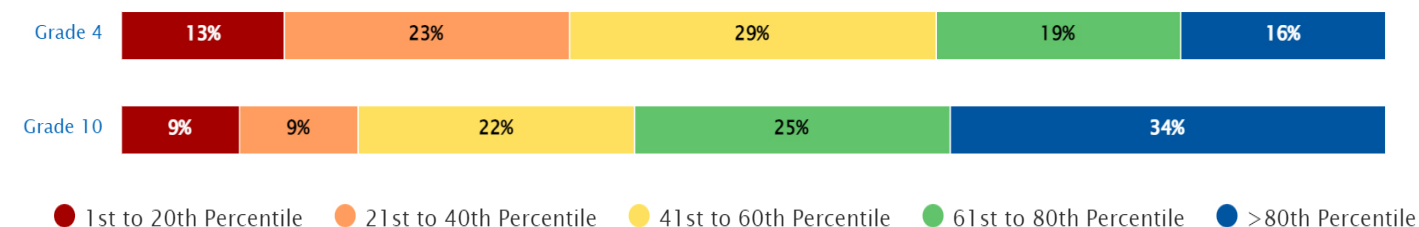
i-Ready Achievement: Math K-5

Receipt and Review of Student Handbook

Under the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), no personally identifiable information maintained by the district may be released without the consent of the parent/guardian or eligible student. An exception to this rule is when the district publishes directory information about its students: a student's name, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight/height of members of athletic teams, photographs, dates of attendance, and awards received in school. This information may be published in sports programs, music and drama programs, news releases, yearbooks, webpage, etc. Parents/guardians may request that the school not publish this information on their child by contacting the school with their request.

I have read a copy of the Joliet Elementary School Student Handbook and I have had my questions answered. I have also shared and discussed this handbook with my parent/guardian.
