vacation time is rewarded after a year of hard work.

The collective energy this year generated positive accomplishments in academics, athletics and various other activities. As a result, Joliet High School has been awarded the Northwestern Energy Academic Excellence Award from MHSA for Class B schools for two of the last three years. This award looks at the overall G.P.A. of all of our student athletes, and ranks them accordingly based on aggregate data from other Class B schools in Montana. Kudos to the teachers, coaches, parents, sponsors, administration, community members, and Joliet School Board who continually provide our students with the resources and support they need to be successful. We obviously have some pretty smart kids as a result of our toil.

As I look across the packed gym during our curricular and co-curricular events, I am frequently awe-struck by the sense of community. A sense that people living here; families, friends, teachers, business leaders and coaches, care about our youth. I love that feeling in Carbon County. A feeling born by believing that kids and schools matter.

Another accomplishment this year was the creation of a new mission statement. A committee, comprised of various stakeholders examined our Joliet Mission Statement, and incorporated the educational community's values to align the mission with the existent vision. In May, the Joliet Board of Trustees readily adopted the new mission: **The Joliet Public School in partnership with home and community is committed to developing upstanding responsible citizens, lifelong learners, and independent thinkers who can effectively navigate their futures and reach their academic and personal potential. While a vision statement outlines what a school district wants to be in the future, a mission statement describes what a district wants to do now. Based on our performances this year, I would say we are well on our way to reaching our future goals.** 

As part of our commitment to future goals, we have taken additional measures to keep our kids and staff safe. As a public school grappling with continued and questionable social dilemmas, increased security is unavoidable. Over the course of two years and multiple conversations, the district has decided to implement security measures by installing a buzz-in system at the main entrance. After 8:15 a.m. every day, visitors will be allowed into the building after verifying their purpose to the K-12 District Secretary. We have explored alternatives through the invitation of public comment, and have consequently arrived at this decision. We place the security of the lives of your students and employees as a top priority, and recognize the constraints it creates for members of our tightknit community. It will take some adjustment and patience as we pull together during this transition, so we thank you, in advance, for your cooperation.

This year is pivotal for our prospective goals due to the legislative session, and potential changes in educational funding. As with most legislative years, the top priority for legislators is moving the state forward with fiscal prudence. Though legislators give attention to educational bills, statewide school funding continues to erode, and typically does not cover the cost of maintaining our buildings or funding our programs at a level conducive for optimal growth. Our schools are aging, and require continued maintenance for the safety of our children and their hardworking teachers and staff. Reduced funding means having to make staffing reductions, which adversely impact class size. It also impacts student co-curricular and extra-curricular programs, textbook adoptions and general technology needs. The Joliet School District does as well as it can, but is hoping for a better political outcome this year. Please be proactive about expressing concerns regarding education. Vocal and written support aides our cause.

The positive stakeholder mentality is paramount in Joliet as it empowers students, and lets them know that the community spirit embraces what they do. Your contributions to our educational community are noticed and greatly appreciated. Thanks for all you do, and for all the community pride you exude.



Article II, Section (3) of the MHSA Handbook requires that a physical exam must be performed for each student in order for that student to be considered eligible for participation in an Association Contest. This certification is valid for a period of one school year. A physical examination conducted before May 1st is not valid for participation for the following school year.



#### INSURANCE JOLIET PUBLIC SCHOOLS CARRIES SUPPLEMENTAL INSURANCE FROM NORTHWESTERN SCHOLASTIC INSURANCE

Forms are available from Mrs. Williams at the District Office. This insurance covers students: a) attending regular school sessions, b) participating in sponsored interscholastic sports, c) participating in school sponsored extracurricular activities, and d) traveling directly to and from school for regular school sessions and to and from school sponsored extracurricular activities while under the supervision of a school employee. This is a secondary insurance and has limited coverage.

# **MEDICINES**

Please return the form for "Self Administration of Medication in Schools" to Mrs. Williams' office. All medications, including overthe-counter medications must remain in the original packaging and cannot be administered without this form on file at the office. ALL medications should be turned into the office, with the exception of asthmatic students who keep their inhalers with them for immediate use. Medicines must not be kept in lockers or backpacks. This policy is in place for the safety of your children.
